



Women's Business Center and Incubator Project



A significant portion of Mongolia's business sector is comprised of informal businesses while small and medium enterprises constitute the majority of enterprises in Mongolia, highlighting this as an area of potential growth. In Mongolia, the female to male labor force participation and women's economic participation in the formal sector is relatively high as compared to other countries in the region. However challenges for women in business remain in the areas of developing solid networks, gaining technical information on how to develop and grow their businesses, and in accessing financial support for entrepreneurial activities. By supporting business development and addressing key constraints facing to women entrepreneurs, Mongolia has an opportunity to build a more stable economy and increase job creation through women's active and full participation.

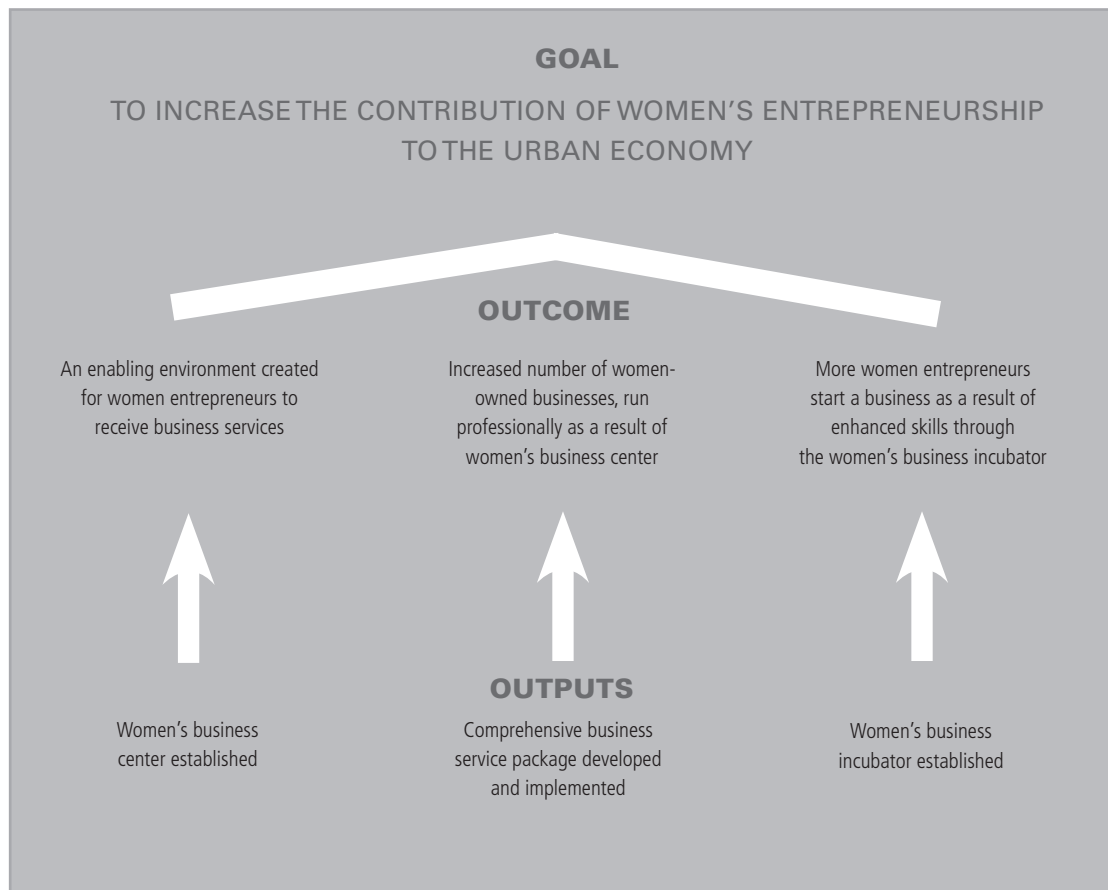
Supporting Ulaanbaatar's Economic Development.

In particular, the services will include business plan creation, business registration, business consultancy, training in marketing, basic accounting, management skills, communications, information on access to finance, plus accelerated business incubator that will provide qualifying women-run new and existing businesses with a supportive environment through continues provision of office facilities, mentoring, business advice and trainings, and networking etc.
