Embassy of Australia, Georgetown Institute for Women, Peace and Security, and The Asia Foundation discuss paths forward to advance women, peace and security



On July 10, The Asia Foundation hosted <u>Views from the Ground:</u> <u>Advancing the Women, Peace and</u> <u>Security (WPS) Agenda in Asia and</u> <u>the Pacific</u> alongside the Australian Embassy and Georgetown Institute for Women, Peace and Security (GIWPS) to share lessons learned in advancing the WPS agenda and discuss emerging issues for the time ahead.

The conversation was moderated by Jane Sloane, Senior Director of The Asia Foundation's Women's Empowerment Program.

Workshops in Mongolia, Laos, and Fiji explore ways to strengthen women's climate resilience

The Foundation recently organized back-to-back workshops in Mongolia, Laos, and Fiji on strengthening women's resilience to climate change and disaster risk.

These workshops provided an opportunity to share key findings and hear from government, civil society, and private sector representatives on national priorities and needs related to climate change and gender equality.

In particular, participants focused on promoting women's participation in the green economy and ensuring that climate change and disaster risk policies include women's needs and capacities.
