

## Indonesia: Covid Early Release Program Provides Unexpected Possibilities for Youthful Offenders in Indonesia

The Indonesian government began releasing prisoners at the onset of the pandemic and The Asia Foundation's *Peduli* program has been working to fill a crucial gap for youth inmates. In partnership with local civil society organizations, The Foundation has assisted 16 youth correctional facilities to improve their implementation of laws on juvenile justice and child protection to smooth youth's return to their families and communities.


### Pacific Island Nations: The Pacific Covid-19 Infodemic
