Learn more about the Foundation's work to build environmental resilience. <u>Timor-Leste</u>: <u>Devastating Floods Hit Timor-Leste</u> In the early hours of April 4, torrential rain overwhelmed the city of Dili, causing severe flash flooding, landslides, and destruction. Forty-two people lost their lives in the floods, and roughly 14,000 have been displaced. The Asia Foundation Timor-Leste office flooded, damaging electronics and other resources. Several staff lost vehicles and were among the displaced. In the wake of this loss, The

Foundation and its incredible staff sprang into action to meet pressing needs. These efforts include support to service providers to ensure vulnerable populations, including those affect by domestic violence, receive the services they need through the Nabilan program; psychological first aid to evacuees; Let's Read educational activity packs for displaced children; and vital emergency supply

Through interviews and focus groups with over 450 people in Cambodia, Indonesia, Myanmar, Malaysia, the Philippines, Thailand, and Timor-Leste, the Foundation led an inquiry into the changing nature of civic spaces to understand the trends, trajectories, and issues affecting civic spaces throughout the region. 
