In Sri Lanka, The Asia Foundation is a trusted link between civil society and government and is valued for our work promoting inclusive subnational governance, improving access to justice, advancing opportunities for women, facilitating effective alternative dispute resolution, supporting the well-being of communities, fostering social cohesion and community dialogue, and strengthening civil society.

Project Highlights

Strengthening community resilience through values TAF's Values4All Sri Lanka Curriculum trained 522 youth on countering misinformation and disinformation and received more than 900k engagements in a social media campaign countering fake news.

More effective mechanisms to improve mental health support

We developed a free online basic psychosocial skills course for first responders available in Tetun, Nepali, English, Sinhala, and Tamil.

Improving women's rights and security, including reducing gender-based violence

TAF trained more than 110 criminal prosecutors on pre-trial consultations for victims of sexual crime and conducted remote service provision, emergency client assistance, and mobile legal aid clinics to victims of domestic violence.

Increasing opportunities for female-led households Provided livelihood support to 1,150 female-headed households disproportionally affected by Sri Lanka's economic crisis.

Strengthening alternative dispute resolution mechanisms

TAF supports accessible and voluntary ways to resolve minor disputes through interest-based mediation. We work with the Ministry of Justice and the Mediation Boards Commission to establish and strengthen Community Mediation Boards and Special Land Mediation Boards across the country by training mediators and mediation trainers and improving systems. We are also expanding our support to commercial mediation, special mediation boards for financial disputes, and commercial arbitration.

Promoting sustainable peace within all communities

Greater social cohesion and improved community resilience are critical following Sri Lanka's ethnic conflict and socioeconomic crises. The Sri Lanka Social Cohesion Grants project supports 24 civil society organizations in building a safer environment for all communities, especially youth, women, and girls, through equitable access to local information and services, inclusive decision-making, and a strengthened sense of civic education and citizenship via emphasis on a better understanding of shared values.

Incentivizing local service delivery

TAF's role in elevating the service standards of Sri Lankan local government authorities has grown during its 15-year engagement. We have sought to address critical systemic challenges that dilute the scope and potential of devolution, undermine the economic resilience of subnational governments and weaken citizens' agency to exercise voice and accountability. In 2022, we facilitated the first performance-based financing program for the government, which helped identify and reward 134 local government authorities that show proof of improved service, innovation, project development and efficient planning and budgeting.

Strengthening mental health services

TAF's mental health and psychosocial support program has helped respond to diverse mental health and psychosocial issues in Sri Lanka for over 15 years. We have developed materials and methods to support both victims of trauma and those in the helping professions—including a peer support system—and practice opportunities for government counselors, casemanagement methods, and self-care programs. The program also trains court family counselors on counseling skills, substance misuse, and marital conflict.

Ensuring women's rights and security

Local women's rights organizations are integral to advancing women's rights and empowerment in Sri Lanka. However, lack of access to resources limits their advocacy, service delivery, and collective activism. We support 26 of these organizations to strengthen their capacity to drive transformative change for women and girls. In 2022, they reached more than 3,000 marginalized and excluded women and girls through counseling, befriending, legal and para-legal aid services, and awareness and advocacy initiatives.
